APPRENTICE – SOFTWARE ENGINEER

BASIC FUNCTION:

Under the direction of the Senior Director, Application, Development and Support and assigned personnel, contribute to the design and development of highly effective applications, products and services for the Office of the Fresno County Superintendent of Schools (FCSS); perform entry-level assignments in a supported learning environment to develop the skills and knowledge in software development, which will assist the apprentice in meeting qualifications to apply and secure future employment and progress successfully in a career.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

- Actively participate in an individualized development plan, as assigned.
- Assist in diagnosing and resolving technical issues in collaboration with the team.
- Assist with creating and maintaining software documentation.
- Collaborate with the development team to conceptualize, code, test, and debug software applications.
- Collaborate with the development team to comprehend coding standards and best practices established by FCSS and development team.
- Contribute to the resolution of software defects, bugs, and performance issues.
- Participate in identifying and rectifying software defects, bugs, and performance issues.
- Participate in the design and development of new applications, features and improvements to existing software.
- Stay abreast of industry trends, emerging technologies, and software engineering best practices.
- Support the documentation of code modifications, development procedures, and project-related information for future reference.
- Work closely with cross-functional teams, including the Systems Analyst, clients, quality assurance, and fellow developers, to deliver top-notch software products.
- Attend and participate in a variety of assigned meetings, in-services and/or special events.
- Comply with schedules, policies, regulations, procedures, orders, and directives of the County Superintendent.
- Exhibit professionally appropriate interpersonal skills including but not limited to tact, patience, flexibility and courtesy.
- Maintain a safe work environment.
- Operate a variety of office equipment, including but not limited to a computer and assigned software applications.
- Work collaboratively and maintain effective working relationships with others in the course of work in assigned area.

OTHER DUTIES:

- Drive a vehicle to conduct work, using own transportation may be required.
- Perform related duties as assigned.

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES:

KNOWLEDGE OF:

- Basic understanding of programming languages and concepts.
- Basic comprehension of the software development lifecycle (SDLC).
- Fundamental knowledge of software security principles and practices.
- Code review procedures.
- Debugging techniques and tools.
- Web development concepts.
- Proper English usage, grammar, spelling, punctuation and vocabulary in all forms of communication.
- State Education Code, local, state and federal laws, codes, regulations and requirements and county office organization, operations, policies and objectives as related to assigned activities and/or instructional area.

ABILITY TO:

- Collaborate with the software engineer team to improve coding skills.
- Document requirements and specifications.
- Follow instructions and learn new tasks.
- Learn and adapt to new technologies and methodologies.
- Learn and take responsibility for their own development.
- Troubleshoot and analyze code for errors.
- Write basic database queries.
- Work flexibly as part of a team.
- Communicate effectively both orally and in writing.
- Drive a vehicle to conduct work, as assigned.
- Interpret, apply, and explain rules, regulations, policies and procedures.
- Maintain consistent, reasonably regular, punctual attendance consistent with federal, state and local standards.
- Work confidentially and with discretion.

WORKING CONDITIONS:

ENVIRONMENT:

- Drive a vehicle to conduct work, using own transportation may be required.
- Office and/or school facility environment.
- Regular interruptions.
- Small and large group meetings.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

- Bending at the waist, kneeling or crouching; climb or balance.
- Eyesight corrected or uncorrected sufficient to read a variety of materials including but not limited to fine print.
- Hearing with or without use of hearing aid(s) sufficient to hear any conversation with others; understandable voice and speech patterns.
- Manual dexterity and coordination sufficient to operate office and/or classroom equipment.
- Sitting, standing and/or walking for extended periods of time.
- Use hands to handle and/or feel; reach with hands and arms.
- Must frequently lift, push, pull or carry up to ten (10) pounds and occasionally lift and/or move up to twenty-five (25) pounds.
